Carroll <m@tthew.org.uk> <p>The Canadian Government has approved Monsanto's herbicide resistant (Roundup Ready) Alfalfa for human consumption and environmental release but Monsanto has not yet applied for variety registration. CBAN produced a <a href="/Ressources/Topics/Regulation-and-Policy/Guide-for-Public-Participation-Seed-Modernization-proposals" target="\_self">guide to these consultations</a> and objected to the changes because we see that they would allow GE crop varieties to be approved quickly and without the safeguards for farmers established through the variety registration process.
